#### ED ARCHER PRESENTING "RACING ON WOOD SPOKE WHEELS" A Very Special Event at the Candy Store April 9<sup>th</sup> 2022

Presented by the Candy Store Foundation as part of its mission to enhance the appreciation and understanding of great automobiles.



Though we might know Ed best for his antique car racing exploits, Ed and Karen Archer live the pre-war life full-time, non-stop. They drive cars made before the first helicopter flight, before electric home refrigerators, and prior to World War I.

Ed works on most of his cars, does race preparation, and he and Karen have amassed awardwinning fur coats, hats, suits, dresses, goggles, gloves, and everything the early 20<sup>th</sup> century had to offer including their house and furnishings.

The short list of the Archer's activities has included cross-country drives, a trip or two up Pikes Peak, the Baja 1000 in a 1909 Model T, racing at many of America's racetracks, some paved and some not, and countless car club events and tours.

Ed has not gone un-noticed for these endeavors. He has received every award offered by the Candy Store and is its longest serving board member. He has amassed many trophies including Excellence in Presentation at the Monterey and Sonoma Historic Races and Ford Motor Company's "Best Ford" twice at the Monterey races. The Archer's Old #4 plus both Karen and Ed have been inducted into the Model T Ford Club of America Speedster and Race Car Hall of Fame!

Ed has been active as a docent trainer at the California Auto Museum for decades and as a member and often president of many antique car clubs. If you don't have a picture of yourself with Ed, Karen and one of their cars, you are in the minority! Perhaps you have seen the Archers in publications such as Motor Trend, Automobile and a centerfold in Life Magazine. Ed might have some explaining to do on that one!
