Everyone missed the wonderful Ardenwood Farm Tour By Ed Archer

After Yoshi passed on, long time member Yoshi Kumi's favorite place to go became an annual tradition, going back some 20 plus years. So to honor Yoshi, on Thursday October 26th Karen and I got up at the crack of dawn, got our act together and headed towards Newark, the home of the historic Ardenwood Farm, now a part of the Alameda and Contra Costa Counties East Bay Regional Park District.

Ardenwood Farm began "life" in the 1850s as a lot of our nation's population east of California all headed west to get rich during the forty niner gold rush. George Patterson was no exception and headed west from Indiana. George didn't do that well in the mines but at least he managed to garner enough money to purchase a large parcel of land in Alameda County now known as the Newark district of Fremont. Patterson called his estate Ardenwood, as it resembled the forested area in England known by that name that he remembered from a Shakespeare play.

Thanks to the E.B.R.P. D. who took it over in the 1980s the Patterson farm is still a working entity, producing corn, grain and a small plethora of other misc. vegetables. There's a working blacksmith shop, a variety of farm animals including some beautiful peacocks, and loads of antique farm equipment including an early Moreland truck. A highlight for Karen and I is always the



Victorian Patterson home originally built in the 1850s, with the major Victorian additions added in the 1880s and some remodeling done as late as the 1910s or so. It's fully furnished and beautifully maintained, restored where needed.

Our day began by digging our old 1924 Chevrolet truck out of the garage. First thing is always oil the rockers on the engine before start up, then as expected, the vacuum tank was dry as I haven't had the old truck out since August and the gas either leaks out or evaporates in that period of time. So, I went through the ritual of removing the small cap on top of the tank and pouring a cup or so of gas into it, hit the starter button on the floor and it fired right up. After a little warm up, it was up the driveway and on down the hill, heading into town.

After a few miles as we headed south on the old Oakland Road toward San Jose, the cell phone rang. "Charlie here, are you going to Ardenwood?" "Yeah, we're on our

way, hey, let me pull over, I can't hear you, the truck is too noisy" Well, without going into detail, it turned out that no one else was going and he said "I'll see you there" I said "don't go just on our account. Since no one else is coming we may just turn around and head home" (I really didn't think I would, but no use dragging



anyone else into a non-attending event unless he really wanted to go). Charlie hadn't quite reached the Dumbarton bridge yet so I convinced him not to go, and Karen and I continued on. The weather was perfect, a little brisk in the shade, but driving in the truck we were getting a little heat from the engine so very comfortable.

As we checked in, we found that the first house tour began at 11:30, and it was only 10:40, so we wandered through the farm, watched the blacksmith perform his red-hot iron miracles, admired some of the unique farm equipment, and petted some of the animals. The sheep are never that friendly but the goats are always reaching out for affection. The corn field was turning brown getting ready for a new crop, and there was a gigantic pumpkin patch with thousands of ripe pumpkins and plenty of ready buyers. We got a good docent for our house tour, very



knowledgeable and fun. And I was able to assist when he said that the Victrola that he loves to demonstrate to visitors, with era music was non-functional. I offered to help and it turned out to be just a lever that was out of place, so easily fixed right on the spot. The Patterson "mansion" is really a spectacular house with all the original furnishings, and well cared for. After the house tour we found a picnic table amidst the trees and enjoyed our lunch watching all the visiting school kids running around having a gay old time.

After lunch we boarded the old truck and took a different route home and to our delight found a gas station with gas for only \$4.39 a gallon.....WOW! let's filler up! Hard to believe that we're now thrilled at \$4.39 a gallon, but that's reality, modern times. Who knows what the future brings. I remember when people were appalled at 37.9, and the early gas wars where we'd find it at 24.9. Ahh, the changing times. Well, we would have had a better time with more of our friends there, but we made the best of it.
